LUTON RUNFEST ROAD CLOSURES

Love Luton is going to be holding its 10th running event on Sunday 15th October 2023. In order to host this event and to ensure the safety of the participants and motorists it will be necessary to close a number of roads and a number of junctions.

Road closures will be in place from 8:00am and is anticipated to end at 12:30pm. During this time the roads listed overleaf (including side roads) will be closed to vehicular traffic and will be reopened at the end of the event or when it is deemed safe to do so. No vehicular access will be permitted on the stated roads for this duration. This also affects a number of side roads which lead onto the main road closures. Pedestrian access will be unaffected. In the event of an emergency then 999 will still respond and emergency vehicles will be able to gain access. Registered carers and blue badge holders will also be able to gain access but they will need to speak to the steward, show their ID badge and they will be then be assisted when it is safe to do so. If residents need to use their cars during this time we encourage you to park it outside of the half marathon footprint so it doesn't impact on your journey.

I apologise in advance for any disruption this may cause and thank you for your cooperation. A number of the runners are raising money for charities including Keech Hospice Care who provide vital services to our local community. Without these types of events they would not be able to fund life-saving equipment and facilities. We would encourage residents to get out and support the runners as they pass your house.

Not only does the race raise money for much needed causes it is also great for the economy with more than 35 per cent of runners travelling into our town.
